# Overall access to preventative care

Percentage of screen eligible patients up to date with cervical screening / Percentage of screen eligible patients up to date with breast cancer screening / Percentage of screen eligible patients up to date with colorectal cancer screening.

#### **About the Indicators**

Cancer screening is an important component of preventative care and a focus for many Ontario Health Teams. According to statistics gathered by Ontario Health, almost a million fewer colorectal cancer, breast cancer, and cervical screenings were conducted between March and December of 2020 than were carried out through the same stretch in 2019.

# Change concept 1: Redesign your system and leverage digital health solutions

Map your local processes with provincial pathway maps to build best practices for the management of patients

- Breast Cancer Screening & Diagnosis Pathway Map (English only)
- Cervical Cancer Prevention & Screening Pathway Map (English only)
- <u>Colorectal Cancer Screening Pathway Map</u> (English only)

For attached patients, develop electronic medical report (EMR) reminder systems like Ocean to recall patients due for cancer screening using reports such as <a href="MyPractice: Primary Care">MyPractice: Primary Care</a> and the <a href="Screening Activity Report">Screening Activity Report</a>. Consider patient preference such as language and method of

communication (e.g., email, text, and phone). Add health promotion messages in reminders. Integrate with online appointment booking systems

Provide patients with information about cancer screening. Integrate health promotion into reminder systems and scheduled visits
