Access and Flow in Long-Term Care: Key Insights From the 2024/25 QIP Submissions

In 2024/25, 612 long-term care (LTC) homes submitted Quality Improvement Plans (QIPs), including 578 individual homes and 34 from multisite or multisector organizations. This summary shares insights from the Access and Flow sections in these QIPs.

Progress Report

486 homes reported their progress on the indicator "Rate of potentially avoidable emergency department (ED) visits"

80% of change ideas (996 out of 1,239) were implemented

99 homes performed better than their 2023/24 target

Most common successes or enablers:

- Onboarded a nurse practitioner (NP)
- Enhanced staff knowledge and skills
- Integrated new equipment, tools, and technologies

Most common challenges or barriers:


- Recruiting an NP or ensuring consistent coverage
- Access to in-home diagnostic equipment or services
- · Managing family and resident requests


Workplan

- Average current performance: 22.2 visits per 100 residents
- Average target set: 17.86 visits per 100 residents
