Population Health Approach in Long-Term Care: Findings From the 2024/25 QIP Submissions

In 2024/25, 612 long-term care (LTC) homes submitted Quality Improvement Plans (QIPs), including 578 individual homes and 34 from multisite or multisector organizations.

The Population Health Approach section was introduced as a new narrative question to explore the partnerships that organizations have established to address the unique needs of their communities. This approach emphasizes delivering proactive services aimed at promoting health, preventing disease, and supporting individuals in managing their conditions. The numbers in this visual denote the number of homes that mentioned collaboration with each professional or service in their QIP.





